In other team news, we are delighted to share that at the recent North Lincolnshire Primary Care Awards, we won the top award - the **General Practitioner Team of the Year!** We are very proud to have won this award in particular as it recognises the contribution of every single member of the team from the GPs, Nursing and Health Care Assistant team, our wider PCN staff and the administration staff and cleaning team. There was some strong competition and to be named the top team out of 19 practices reflects all the hard work and commitment to patient care from everyone at Church Lane Medical Centre.

GP PATIENT SURVERY RESULTS

The annual GP Patient survey results have been published, and we are delighted to be recognised as one of the top-rated practices in North Lincolnshire! The nationwide survey, is conducted annually by Ipsos MORI and published by NHS England, and gathers a randomly selected number of patients' feedback on various aspects of their healthcare journey, including access to GPs, appointment-making and quality of care.



From the responses received, Church Lane Medical Centre stood out as the **top-rated town practice in Scunthorpe** and one of the highest in both North and North East Lincolnshire for Overall Experience. We had impressive scores that were higher than the national and county averages in every single area including:

- 89% described their Overall Experience as good
- 63% found it easy to get through on phone (increased from 44% last year)
- 93% found the receptionists to be helpful
- 100% of patients had confidence and trust in the healthcare professional
- 100% of patients felt that their needs had been met

WORLD BREAST FEEDING WEEK 1ST-7TH AUGUST

CQC INSPECTION

In May we had a CQC (Care Quality Commission) Inspection over the telephone. The CQC is the independent regulator of health and adult social care in England. They make sure health and social care services provide people with safe, effective, compassionate, high-quality care and we encourage care services to improve. They will monitor, inspect and regulate services and publish the results they find. Our last onsite inspection was in 2015 and further site visits had been postponed due to COVID so this was well overdue! Since then, the guidance has changed and the CQC will only visit GP practices currently if there are any concerns over patient safety. Otherwise all aspects of care are reviewed remotely.

We are delighted to say that we passed the inspection with flying colours in all areas; the CQC were impressed with all the measures we had in place and therefore will not be carrying out an onsite inspection.
